The Professional Networking Programme is unique to RHS and exists to help you develop relationships, further your goals, and inspire the next generation.


Each event is free and easily accessible. The format is very simple. Those under the age of 25 are invited to arrive at 18:30 to hear up to five alumni who will tell their story. We explore their industry, the career opportunities within their sector, and top tips to those just starting out. At 19:00 those over the age of 25 arrive and the networking for everyone begins - with complimentary drinks and canapés. A full list of attendees and their sectors is sent out in advance, which enables you to plan your networking. Sixth form pupils also attend to make the most of the friendly and supportive opportunity.

Last year there were five events, bringing together over 300 alumni, pupil and staff. We also have 25 speakers from sectors such as marketing, finance, technology, strategic planning, armed forces, insurance, sales, digital, management consultancy, to name a few.

Our aim this year is to connect with more than 500 of you. We will be holding 6 networking events: three in London (19 November, 18 February and in May), three regional events will be held in Nottingham (22 October), Edinburgh (10 March) and Portsmouth (2 June). 


